

Hi Guys! Welcome to another Lets AirSick How-To! started! We aiready prepped a black panel and taped off a section for this tutorial. This one is going to be a little different from some of our other tutorials. We are going to tape back over the prepped area so that the whole area is masked off. Now we are going to take our stencil and shoot some black through it. We do this so that we can make a outer mask for this design and keep our outer lines tight and clean.





As you can see in these first couple of steps, we have sprayed our stencil on a taped off section. The next part is to cut along the outer edge of the design. This will give us a negative mask. You can also just cut out one section at a time, this may help you concentrate on the individual element that your painting. Just below you can see what the cut out mask looks like. As shown in step 6, we give a light dusting of white, this is going to allow us to build up layers of white and black. You don't want this part solid white, you should just give it enough coverage to look like a light gray.

Now we are going to place our stencil back over the part we just cut out and spray it with black. Check out the results in step 8. The lines in this stencil gives us a great starting point but we still need to detail it. You may notice that one of the cards is taped off. This is the ace of hearts and its red, so we will paint this later on. Well someone wasn't paying attention, cough...cough... Sean... and forgot to cover the diamond as well.....we'll fix that later

We want a little more white for the skull so we go over it with white again to make sure that this part is a little more solid. You can see that we covered some of the black, that's ok we can go back over it with the stencil to darken up some of the lines.

## STEP 10



Here we begin to render the skull, we start by darkening some of the areas that were just painted over. You can use the stencil to add more black or you can just freehand over it like we did here.

# STEP II




We don't want the finished art to look like a stencil, so this step is very important. Here we are using the same black to fill in some of the breaks in the stencil.

# STEP 12



You can go through the design and fill in any of these little gaps. This will get rid of the stencil look and really helps make this look like a solid piece of artwork.

# STEP 13



As we are filling in some of the gaps, we take time to go over some of the darker areas. Adding in some black to the eyes and nose. We also add some light dagger strokes to the banner.

# STEP 14



Here's what we have so far. You can see the skull is a little brighter than the rest of the design. Its still pretty flat so we need to start shading and rendering the rest of the design.

Going from step 15 to step 16 we start to shade the skull, adding in light layers of black around the ridges of the bone. Once you have established a good base for your shadowed areas in the skull its time to move onto the banner.

Next we add light shadows around the creases and folds. The shadows in this one follow along the edge of the dagger strokes we laid down earlier. You can get an overall view how the design looks with its first layer of black shading in the picture for step 18 on the right.

# STEP 20+



To finish up we add a few final highlights in the banner, a light streak on the cards and dice and in the protruding features of the skull. The last thing that we need to do is paint the red cards. We place our stencil over the art work making sure that we have it aligned in the same place and shoot red through the hearts and the diamonds. We pull of our tape mask and can finally see the result below. Painting the stencil onto the mask gave us a nice clean and crisp outline. This is a great way to protect other artwork under your design from over spray and any other potential problems that you may run into along the way. We wanted to keep this tutorial kind of basic so we just used white and black and a little red. When you try this one out play around with some other colors. Make the dice red or green, add some candy root beer to the banner to give it an aged look. How many different ways can you come up with to paint this stencil?
